By the time you read this Jumbunna edition, we will have less than one week of the 2022 school year. It has been a massive endeavour getting through our first full year of school in three years. There have been challenges along the way but also lots to celebrate. Some of the highlights of the year have been:

- students have made growth with their learning
- seven students completing the High Abilities Program
- celebrating our 50th Birthday in March with over 1000 of our closest LEPS family members
- five successful grant applications (shade sail, Queen's Jubilee Trees, plants, playground and Vacation Care totally over \$120 000)
- the introduction of our composting program
- gardening leaders running lessons in the classrooms
- completing the first 4 modules of the Resilience Rights and Respectful Relationships Program
- successful introduction of the Sexual Health Victoria personal development sessions for grades 5-6
- incredible fundraising efforts by the JSC, School Council and broader school community - over \$11 000 to date.

Parent Contributions

Thank you to those families who have already come into the office to finalise your child's 2023 payments. Generally over 85% of families normally make these payments. This year less than 30% of families have made these payments. This is a significant decrease in funds for the school and will result in us having to review our current practices and programs and what we are able to offer our students and families moving forward.

At less than \$200 for most grades our book fees are one of the lowest of all schools. We

understand that many families are experiencing financial hardship but ask that you still try to pay the Parent Contributions to support your child's learning at LEPS. Every cent paid by parents is used to benefit our students. Every dollar helps, and we would really appreciate families popping into the office and contributing whatever you can to support your children and the school.

Planting Trees for The Queen's Jubilee

We want to talk to you about a very important and exciting project happening around the school involving the planting of lots of trees.

We were very lucky to get a \$10,000 grant from the federal government to plant big trees around the school. These trees will grow nice and tall to give us heaps of shade and bring beautiful birds into our school. These trees will be planted to honour Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth's Jubilee year which is this year.



You may have seen the wonderful planter boxes behind the Octane building. These are where three of the trees are going to be planted. Thank you to everyone who helped us shovel the dirt into the boxes, it was great to see so many of you willing to help.

Next year we will be planting some more trees around the school including on the big grass area at the front, all dedicated to remembering The Queen's Jubilee year.

The Queen was very important as she ruled over Britain and the Commonwealth, which includes Australia. This year marked her 70th year as Queen. She became Queen on the 6th of February 1952 when she was only twenty five years old. The Queen visited Australia 16 times during her reign, most recently in 2011. This year in September The Queen sadly passed away, but she will always be remembered as the longest serving British King or Queen.



We hope you enjoy the new trees and the seating area. Please be respectful around the planter boxes and only use the seats to sit on.
