Student Progress

The school uses a variety of different ways to update families about their child's progress at school. This includes Learning Tasks, Three Way Conferences and Semester reports.

Learning tasks are made available approximately every three weeks and provide specific feedback about a student's progress in Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Personal and Social Learning. Make sure you take the time to check Compass to receive feedback regarding your child's progress so far this year in Writing and Mathematics.

Three Way Conferences are scheduled for the last week of term 1, after school on Monday 3 April and Wednesday 5 April. Information will be sent to families soon, so you can make a booking to meet and chat to your child's teacher. I encourage all parents to make time to attend these interviews so you can receive feedback about how your child has settled into their new grade level.

Dan Petro - Behaviour Analyst visit

On 6 March and 7 March Dan Petro, a Behaviour Analyst, visited our school. Dan spent time in all classrooms and all specialist classes observing students and teachers. After each observation, Dan shared feedback with teachers to enhance their practice. Staff also engaged in further professional development on Tuesday afternoon where Dan presented a specific direction in which our school can move into.

We thank Dan for his time and sharing his expertise with us.

Term 1 - RRRR lessons

Our **Stress Management** unit is now coming to an end. This unit has focused on children and young people experiencing a range of personal, social and work-related stressors in their everyday lives. Activities within this topic have an explicit focus on teaching positive approaches to stress management. Assisting students to recognise their personal signs and symptoms of stress, and to develop strategies that will help them to deal with stress effectively, will help students cope with future challenges. The activities focus on the ways in which self-calming strategies can be used to manage stressful situations

As you would have read in previous newsletters, each term our students engage in Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationship lessons. Next term students will be focusing on the unit **Help Seeking.** Learning activities in this topic area are designed to help students discuss the importance of seeking help and providing peer support when dealing with problems that are too big to solve alone.
