#### **3 Way Conferences**

#### **Ride2School Day**

It was very exciting to have so many students come to school in an 'active' way on Friday 24 March for National Ride2School Day. 97 of our 218 students rode their bike, scooter, skateboard, rollerblades or walked to school on the day. Just over 44% which is a terrific start on our quest to be more active.

We had over 36 wheeled items in our bike shed on the day which is our highest number since we opened our bike shed last year. There are lots of positive physical and mental health benefits from being active. We all struggle at times to be active but by encouraging your child to ride or walk to school each day, you are helping to get them on a positive path to being fit for life.

#### **Prep -2 Playground Project Update**

Last week we refreshed the sand in our Prep-2 play space. The sandpit is a very popular part of the Prep- Year 2 play area and the students were very excited to have new sand added to the play space. They were over the moon when we also added new buckets, spades and sieves!

Apologies to families for the extra sand that came home in shoes, socks and pockets! We also had to apologise to Gloria (our cleaner) for the extra sand in the buildings.

Despite the extra mess, this type of play teaches the students many valuable skills in an informal way. It teaches them problem solving, cooperation by needing to share space and equipment and inspires their creativity to 'build' new structures. It also teaches them about impermanence, that sometimes the creations we make do not always last. The great thing about sand play is you can start fresh every time.

In other exciting news, the Junior School Council and School Council have approved the quote for our new Prep-2 equipment. The new equipment includes a slide, lots of different climbing structures, new monkey bars and a balance beam. We are hoping the new equipment will be installed during the June holidays. The JSC has also kindly donated funds from their zooper dooper sales to help cover the cost of the new equipment. The school was successful with our Active Schools grant application and will receive \$30 000 towards the cost of the equipment from the government. Our fundraising efforts form the last 18 months have also helped to fund the difference. Playground equipment is expensive but is vital to help students be active and engaged while at school.

We will keep you updated about the progress of this project throughout term 2. I have included two small images of the new equipment to give you a bit of a peep at what the new equipment will look like.

#### **Change of Details**

#### **Wellbeing Space**


This term has been a busy one in the Wellbeing Space!
